Friendship Christian School Home School Policy

The NCCSA adopted the following policy for home-school student participation in NCCSA sponsored athletic and fine art competitions beginning August 2008.

“Since home school students are unable to take core courses at the school they are representing, the two on-site courses can be electives, Bible class, or any lab-type classes that follow the criteria. The criteria include:

- 1) Elective courses must be eligible for at least ½ academic credit each
- 2) These courses must meet 2-3 times a week for at least the regular class-period time
- 3) The ½ credit that is earned by each class must be eligible to be included on the student transcript
- 4) The elective courses must be offered to any other non-athletic participating students
- 5) These electives cannot be private voice lessons, private instrument lessons, or any other type of private lessons.

Private lessons, at most schools, do not normally earn academic credit, and thereby cannot be used as the two on-site courses. Please note that all five criteria must be satisfied in order for eligibility to be granted.”

Based on the new NCCSA policy Friendship Christian School has adopted the following guidelines for home-school families.

1. Home-school students may participate in athletic or fine arts as long as the above criteria is met. (Future guidelines may be adopted as far as number of participants).
2. The above policy does not apply to NCCSA All-State Band.
3. Athletic participation guidelines will be enforced.
4. All home-school students must go through the application process and pay the full application fee for initial enrollment.
5. All home-school students must pay a prorated enrollment fee and the required reenrollment fee per year.
6. The family is responsible for a prorated student resource fee and tuition fee rounded up to the nearest dollar based on number of credits taken. A family may also be charged the full cost of a book, if needed for that class and it is greater than the resource fee.
7. The family is responsible for all club fees and participation fees for the area that they are involved in.
