Middle and High School Courses

- Most of our students enroll with the understanding that they are entering a program of courses that will prepare them for college. Middle school math is offered at the honors and college prep levels as early as seventh grade. The high school curriculum is distinctly college preparatory in design and includes honors level and dual credit classes in most subjects. We offer a strong core of classes supplemented with various electives to develop a well-rounded student. Course electives include foreign language, computer based classes, art, music, speech, drama, choir, band, forensics, and honors anatomy. We strive to present a Christian worldview in all of our classes. Over 98% of our graduates pursue college degrees. The majority of our students would be eligible for a **College Prep Course of Study or College Prep Course of Study with an Honors Option**.
- Dual credit courses are available for approved juniors and seniors. Over the past several years we have expanded our dual credit course options to include US History 1 and 2, PreCalculus, Calculus, English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition, Advanced Biology, Old Testament Survey, New Testament Survey, Music Appreciation, and Speech. Students can earn up to 35 college credits while at FCS.
- We also minister to the needs of students with documented learning disabilities through our **Academic Success Center (ASC)**. Students who have learning disabilities generally have IQ scores that fall in the average to above average range. While these students have the potential to learn, they may struggle to reach their potential because of their learning disabilities. For an additional fee, eligible students in grades 3-8 may take ASC resource classes in a small group environment for particular learning needs (Language Arts or Math). These classes are taught on grade level using the same materials as the mainstream classes. Students in 6th-12th grade may also enroll in tutorial study hall (additional fee) for academic support. Based on the courses that are successfully completed, these students would be eligible for either a **General Course of Study or a College Prep Course of Study**.
- In addition, Friendship Christian School is unique in that we also accept students who have intellectual disabilities. As these students approach sixth grade, they may enter the **Focus Learning Center (FLC)** which concentrates on general academics and life skills in a self-contained environment. Careful planning and review of the students' past academic performance and current cognitive and achievement levels will assist in making this decision. These students would be eligible to receive either an **Occupational Course of Study** or a **Certificate of Achievement**. The tuition for this program is separate from the regular school tuition. The Occupational Course of Study covers the basics of the core subjects which specifically focus on post-school employment and independent living. Successful completion of this program will provide the student with a solid, basic education but will not meet the requirements for entrance to a four year college or university. Successful completion of this program, however, will allow for continued training in a technical or vocational program or a community college.

Student Opportunities: (6th -12th grade)

- Chapel: Students are encouraged to be involved through special music and other activities.
- Student Council: The council is a service organization by which students help the administration in the planning of certain activities and chapels.
- Athletics: We have a full range of sports for boys and girls. We have boys' soccer, basketball, and baseball. We have girls' volleyball, basketball, cheerleading, and soccer. We have co-ed cross-country and golf.
- Fine Arts: We have many opportunities for boys and girls. We have choir, band, speech, yearbook, art, and drama.
- Field trips: Each year we encourage our teachers to take the students on a variety of educational field trips. Advance notification is sent out. We also have static field trips for each grade each year.
